The Respite Care Program:

- Provides children with pre-arranged care when their caregiver needs to take a break.
- Allows caregivers to receive up to 72 continuous hours of respite care services per child, per year.
- Respite Care Providers are licensed caregivers who have volunteered for this service and will receive \$10.00 per hour, per child.

Qualifications:

- Approved** Relative Caregivers, Non-Related Extended Family Members and Licensed Foster Parents in **open DCFS cases**.
- Case being serviced out of the **Belvedere, Compton, Van Nuys or Pasadena DCFS Offices**. (*Group Homes, FFA placements, Non-Paid Placements and Non-Foster Care Placements, and cases being serviced out of other DCFS offices not stated here, do not qualify at this time*).
